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Welcome Letter from the NECLTA President

Dear NECLTA members and friends,

As we gather for the 12th Annual Conference of the New England Chinese Language Teachers Association, it is my great pleasure to extend to you the warmest of welcomes. As we gather today under the banner of this year's conference theme, "Bridging Cultures, Empowering Minds," we work together to strengthen the communication that fosters mutual cultural understanding, and to empower individuals to develop the empathy to connect with others.

This year's conference submissions were notable for both their quality and quantity — the latter of which hit a record high. To accommodate this influx of high-quality proposals, we have expanded our program by adding one additional conference room to accommodate all the presentations. A total of 52 submissions were confirmed for presentation, including 2 workshops, 1 session featuring mini-grant award recipients, 4 panel discussions, and an impressive 45 individual paper presentations. This was a significant increase from last year's submissions, which included 26 individual paper presentations and five panel discussions. We are also very fortunate and honored to have with us Prof. Jianhua Bai from Kenyon College, who will deliver the keynote speech titled "ICC Can-Do Statement and Their Applications in Teaching CFL."

NECLTA's mission has always been to advance the teaching of Chinese language and culture at all educational levels and to support Chinese language teachers through opportunities for professional development and the exchange of experiences and views. The past several years have been a testament to the incredible resilience and adaptability of our association. With great pride, I can share that our community has grown considerably, even in the face of challenges. Our membership, which includes professionals from both K-12 (34%) and college (64%) settings, has increased to 140 by the end of 2022. This is a direct result of the enthusiastic participation of our members and the unwavering dedication of our board members!

Over the past year, we have continued our commitment to professional development by hosting two workshops: "Integrating Intercultural Communicative Competence into Foreign Language Teaching" led by Prof. Bing Mu from University of Rhode Island and "Challenges and Possibilities for Anti-racism in Chinese Language Teaching in K-12 Schools" let by Prof. Wenhao Diao from University of Arizona. We also collaborated with China Institute and coorganized an online lecture series named "Understanding of Chinese Culture & Practice." Additionally, NECLTA awarded 76 PDP certificates to K-12 instructors through Tufts University during the past year.

I am also thrilled to share two significant new developments within our organization during this past year. First, we have established the NECLTA Mini Teaching Innovation Award for college instructors. This accolade recognizes teaching excellence in Chinese language and culture and honors those who pioneer new practices and strategies to enhance students' learning experiences. Secondly, we have launched the NECLTA K-12 Teacher Mentoring Program. This initiative underscores our commitment to nurturing the next generation of Chinese language educators. By

pairing 10 junior K-12 instructors with experienced mentors, we aim to provide valuable guidance on curriculum design, program management, and community outreach.

Last but not least, I would like to express our heartfelt gratitude to our gracious host, Tufts University, for providing us with the beautiful Joyce Cummings Center as our venue this year. To all those who submitted proposals, thank you for your invaluable contributions, and to those present here today, your participation is the heartbeat of this conference.

Once again, we deeply appreciate your steadfast dedication and commitment to the New England Chinese Language Teachers Association. May your conference experience be filled with inspiration and insights.

Keynote Speaker

演讲嘉宾 白建华教授



白建华教授,现为美国肯杨大学终身教授,曾荣获大学董事会颁发的资深教授优秀教学奖,并曾担任过现代语言文学系系主任和亚洲研究项目主任。他曾于2002年至2017年担任明德大学中文暑校校长。近年来,他的研究兴趣主要包括外语教学与评估、教师培训、教育技术在中文教学中的应用以及行动研究等领域。白建华教授目前还担任世界汉语教学学会理事,以及美国国际教育委员会中国领航项目高级学术顾问。

此外,他曾担任全美中文教师学会理事和学会会长(2003-2004),美国 AP 中文考试发展委员会主席、考试主考官,以及美国大学理事会学术顾问等职务。

Keynote Speech

ICC CAN-DO Statement and Their Applications in Teaching CFL 国际中文教学中跨文化交际能力的培养

跨文化交际能力的培养是国际中文教学课程的重要组成部分。本次讲座首先指出跨文化交际能力培养的重要性,然后以美国外语学会的跨文化交际能力的分级标准 (The NCSSFL-ACTFL Can-Do Statements for Intercultural Communicative Competence, ICC)为依据,探讨如何在国际中文教学中培养学生的跨文化交际能力。在介绍 2017 年美国外语学会发表的跨文化能力标准 (ICC Can-Do Statements) 的同时,我们将讨论如何在这套标准的指导下改善国际中文课程设计以及国际中文跨文化交际能力的测试。讲座的最后部分对现有教学实例进行分析,展示如何在国际中文教学中既做到重视语言要素的学习,又有效地融入跨文化交际能力的培养。

Conference Venue

The Conference, including plenary sessions and breakout sessions, will be held in the newly built Joyce Cummings Center at 177 College Ave, Medford, MA 02155.

Public Transportation

If you are coming by the MBTA subway, often called the "T," you can travel to Tufts on the Red Line or the Green Line.

The E branch of the Green Line brings you directly to the front of the Joyce Cummings Center. Take the Green Line E branch to the Medford/Tufts stop. When exiting the station onto College Ave, you will see the Center right in front of you.

Alternatively, you can take the Red Line to the Davis Square station. Exit the Davis Square station on the College Avenue side. You may take the #94 or #96 bus (which both leave from the Davis Square T entrance directly across from the 7-Eleven convenience store, NOT the entrance next to the Somerville Theatre) or walk 23 minutes along College Avenue to the Joyce Cummings Center.

Parking


Tufts has made arrangements for you to park in the Cousens Parking Lot and the Dowling Garage. We recommend that you use the Cousens Parking Lot (161 College Avenue, Medford), as it is right across from the Joyce Cummings Center. Tufts will cover the costs of parking. We will send you a QR code a few days before the conference. You will scan the code on the day of the event and provide your license plate. If you forget to do this before coming to Tufts, just

remember to scan the code at the registration desk when you come to the JC Center. You can park in these two lots from 8am to 6pm on Saturday, September 30, 2023.
